With reference to the works of Jhumpa Lahiri, particularly her short stories, critically examine how she portrays the diasporic experience of South Asian immigrants. How does Lahiri navigate themes of nostalgia, hybridity, alienation, and the tension between tradition and assimilation in her characters' lives?
